UPPER and Lower

Write each of your words out two times.

Fancy Letters

Write each of your words using fancy writing.

Your letters could be *curly* or dotty... or whatever you decide!

Letter Magnets

Look at the words in your jotter. Try to make each one using the letter magnets. Check if you used the correct letters!

Pyramid Writing

Write each of your words like a pyramid:

Curly Words

First write out your words in normal writing. Next, write them again in curly letters.

Join the Dots

Write each of your words using dots.

Then join the dots with a coloured pencil to make your word.

ABC Order

Write your words out in alphabetical order.

Rainbow Words

Write your words out in pencil.

Next draw around each letter 5 more times using a different coloured pencil.

Air Writing

Write your words in the air with your finger. Ask someone to read your words as you write. Or ask someone to air write the letters you tell them to spell your word.

Backwards Words

Write your words out forwards then backwards.
