Dear Friends,

As I write this we are half way through the season of Creationtide. At St Peter's on Sunday, we explored together the wonderful words of Psalm 8 (do have a read, it really is a beautiful psalm). In it, David writes 'what is humankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honour'. To know that we are made in God's image and loved beyond measure is precious and something that we should daily give thanks for, but with this crown comes responsibility; in how we relate to the whole of the created world.

I don't know about you but sometimes the weight of responsibility feels great and the worries and doubts can creep in. However this afternoon, my eyes glanced to the side of my desk where I have a poem by Helen Mallicoat which says this:

I was regretting the past and fearing the future... Suddenly my Lord was speaking: "My name is I AM."

He paused. I waited. He continued,

"When you live in the past, with its mistakes and regrets, it is hard. I am not there. My name is not I was.

"When you live in the future, with it's problems and fears, it is hard. I am not there. My name is not I will be.

"When you live in this moment, it is not hard. I am here. My name is I AM".

We know that God is past, present and future, but for me this poem reminds me of the importance of living with God in the now; sharing our lives and placing our trust in the one who loves us.

As I was thinking about this, it struck me that to live in the moment, makes us more attentive to what is around us. When anything has our full attention, it gets the best of us rather than the slightly frazzled, mind elsewhere part of us and I'm left wondering, what difference could that make to how we relate to our wonderful Lord, the people around us and the world in which we live?

WINSLEY CHURCH HALL REMINDER - WORK ON THE NEW ROOF

The work on the roof started on Monday 2nd September and will take 3-4 weeks with fair weather. In September the arrangements and restrictions for using the hall are:

- It will be closed during the working day Monday to Friday and some Saturdays. It is planned that it will be available for use in the evenings and on Sundays.
- Sunbeams and Kettle's On will take place in the <u>church</u> during September. Access to the toilets in the hall will be possible on Wednesday mornings.
- With the exception of a few spaces reserved for the social club and School House, the church hall car park will be closed as the space is needed by the contractor.
- The hall will be surrounded by low-level scaffolding, but gaps will be left so that the principal entrances can be used.


