Dear Friends,

Have you ever thought about meditation? You have probably heard of it as a way of de-stressing or lowering your blood pressure. But meditation is an ancient form of contemplative prayer, found throughout the ages of the Christian tradition, and today is widely recognised as a form of prayer that is much needed in this hectic world. More and more schools teach it to children. You can start at any age.

It is a prayer of silence, stillness and attention. It is often referred to as the prayer of the heart. In meditation, we allow the mind and body to become still and silent so we can be in the presence of 'Christ in us' (Colossians 1v27). We learn in this way to become less distracted and more present to God and ourselves and to those we live and work with. It doesn't replace other forms of prayer. On the contrary it can help to deepen one's experience of all other prayer practices.

You may not be aware but for the past twenty years a group of people has gathered every week on a Monday afternoon (except on Bank Holidays) in one of our churches in the Benefice, to sit in silence for about 20 minutes. These days we always meet in St Nicholas Church Winsley, from around 4.15pm when people drift in and sit where ever they wish. Quiet, gentle music is playing and then just after 4.30pm I welcome the group, have a brief reading, say the Christian Meditation prayer, gently tap the prayer bowl three times to mark the formal start of the silence which then lasts 20 minutes or so. This ends with three taps on the prayer bowl, a piece of music for a few minutes and the prayer of the Grace said by us all. Some people stay briefly to talk to one another, others choose to leave immediately.

We are a core group of just over 20 people who gather. It is not always the same people each week who come. It might be five one week, ten another. People come when they choose to. We are part of The World Community of Christian Meditation that was originally started by John Main, a Benedictine Monk in the 1970's.

We are not trying to achieve anything, to become better people, more prayerful, more holy. We do not seek anything special, some great insight or discernment or to solve things. We are just there, resting in the silence and allowing the silence to enfold us, believing that where two or three are gathered in his name, God is in our midst. As Meister Eckhart, a 14th century Christian teacher said, 'there is nothing so like God as Silence'.

It can seem odd at first, pointless perhaps. We live in a such driven world where it's about doing, not being, about acquiring or achieving. Sitting in silence can feel threatening as one's mind churns on relentlessly with all manner of distractions. In Christian Meditation we silently and slowly repeat a word or phrase, often called a mantra, to help focus our minds. Some people use Maranatha – the Aramaic language of Jesus, it means, 'Come Lord, come Lord Jesus'. Others might just say 'Jesus' or 'Abba' silently. When we become distracted (which is a common experience), we gently return to our mantra.

If you are interested to know more then please contact me or you might like to drop in one Monday afternoon around 4.15pm or so and share the silence – all are welcome.
